- Immigrants are nearly twice as likely as U.S.-born to start new businesses according to analysis of entrepreneurial activities between 1996 and 2008.
- Currently, 75 percent of hired agricultural workers in the United States are foreign born.
- The 2009 purchasing power of Illinois's Latinos totaled \$43.6 billion—an increase of 393.4% since 1990.
- Illinois' 59,367 Asian-owned businesses had sales and receipts of \$18.5 billion and employed 102,991 people, according to the U.S. Census Bureau's 2007 Survey of Business Owners.
