Giving away free vegetarian and vegan food to those who need it most, Food Not Bombs is a loose-knit group of people hoping to use surplus foods from grocery stores, bakeries, and markets that would have gone to waste to fight hunger. Started in the early 1980s, the all-volunteer global movement protests war and poverty through serving the free surplus food in public places like parks.
