

Troy Davis, an innocent man on Georgia's Death Row, faces death for the fourth time September 21. Troy's case has been the focus of an international campaign for justice. Troy Davis is clearly innocent of the murder of a Savannah police officer. There is no physical evidence against him. And seven of the nine witnesses have recanted their testimony, saying Troy is not guilty.

Many report police pressure to testify against Troy.

In Illinois, this sort of injustice system was abolished in 2011 following a decade-long grassroots struggle, the exposure of police torture, and the revelation of innocent men murdered in the state's electric chair.

Troy's execution is set for 6:00 pm CDT, Sept. 21. Gather with us as we either celebrate the announcement of Troy's clemency and our victory over injustice, or as we speak out against another in a long line of shameful legal lynchings that are all too common in the U.S. Injustice System.
