- Rock Out Against Rape (ROAR): This benefit concert is to raise funds for the agency and promote awareness about sexual violence. It will be held either April 30 or May 1 as part of Sexual Assault Awareness Month (SAAM).
- Take Back the Night (TBTN): This rally and march against sexual violence are scheduled for April 22, and are also part of SAAM.

A Brief VIP History:

In 1963, a group of fifty University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign students collaborated to provide tutoring services to the schools in the Urbana-Champaign area. Students began taking note of the need for volunteer services in all other aspects of the community, which led to the formation of the Illini House, forerunner of Volunteer Illini Projects. Services expanded rapidly by 1965, VIP became incorporated as a not-for-profit organization. Since then, the number of student volunteers has risen to more than 2,000! In 2005, over 15,000 hours of volunteer work were contributed. As the largest student-staffed student-run organization in the state. Volunteer Illini Projects volunteers work to improve the partnership between students and the local community.
